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Why Safer Spaces?



We focused on this idea of Safe Spaces after incidents of vandalism in the Library and on campus in 2018 and 2019. Unidentified persons vandalized dispensers for period products placed in men's and gender neutral restrooms. We were concerned that these incidents in the Library were contributing to an unsafe environment and wanted to collect student feedback about how to improve.

We recognize that the term "Safe Space" is not preferred because BIPOC and LGBTQ+ folx can never truly feel "safe" in these spaces. Instead, we are adopting the term Safe(r) Spaces as a reminder that we can improve and create safer spaces for our BIPOC and LGBTQ+ users.

Process

Conducted focus group sessions

Created transcripts from session and anonymized

Generated a codebook

Imported transcripts into Excel

Assigned a code to individual sentences


Compiled like codes and calculated statistics

Results

💡 Offered cultural competency training to Library staff

💡 Revised policies to use gender neutral language
